Individuals

Volunteers are key members of the Doorways team out in the community, at our administrative offices, and in our shelters. Volunteers can and do train to work in virtually all of Doorways' programs! *See the back for volunteer position requirements and training information for each level.*

- **Level 1:** Volunteer opportunities that do not require any orientation or training and can be done by any individual or group on a one-time or ongoing basis.
- Level 2: Volunteer opportunities which include minimal or no direct interaction with Doorways' clients.
- Level 3: Volunteers provide direct support to Doorways' clients.

Level 1 Volunteer Opportunities

- <u>Community Advocate</u>: Learn about our clients' needs and advocate on their behalf. Attend an event, join our online communities on Facebook), Twitter, Instagram, and more!
- Fundraiser: Host your own fundraising event or online fundraiser to support Doorways' critical work.
- Conduct a Drive: Collect needed items such as household and personal care items, school supplies, etc.

Level 2 Volunteer Opportunities

- <u>Administrative Office Volunteer</u>: Assist with answering phones, special projects, research, spreadsheets, and other administrative tasks as needed. Daytime availability needed.
- <u>Facility Volunteer</u>: Provides small-scale handyperson services and skills at our shelters. Volunteer shifts consists of 2-3 hours every 2 weeks or as needed. Regular daytime work hours preferred with occasional evenings.
- Yard Care Volunteer: Provide yard care services at our shelter. Volunteer shifts available at least twice per month.

Level 3 Volunteer Opportunities

- <u>Safehouse Coverage Volunteer</u>: Provide direct service to shelter clients. Answer 24-Hour Domestic & Sexual Violence Hotline, provide information and support to people in crisis, and assist staff in the day-to-day operations of the shelter.
- <u>Family Home Coverage Volunteer</u>: Provide direct service to shelter clients. Answer helpline, provide support to people in crisis, provide information, and assist staff in the day-to-day operations of the shelter.
- Hospital Accompaniment Volunteer: Provide crisis intervention, advocacy, referrals and support to survivors of domestic and sexual violence at the hospital.
- <u>Children's Program Volunteer:</u> Provide childcare while parents attend important meetings such as weekly support groups and parenting groups.
- **Volunteer Interpreter/Translator:** Looking to use your language talents? Many of Doorways clients' primary language is not English. Provide interpretation at group and individual client meetings.
- <u>Community Education/Outreach Volunteer</u>: Support Doorways and connect with the community by tabling at events and assisting with awareness months. Volunteer opportunities are limited and are on an as-needed basis.
