
# DOORWAYS PREVENTION PROGRAM

#### TARGET POPULATION



#### EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING

Doorways aims to promote and provide education for youth and their caregivers to establish protective factors against dating and sexual violence and develop skills that allow them to engage in healthy relationships in a responsible, respectful, and nonviolent way.
